Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete this year's survey!

- 14% of SCHS families (333 out of 2310 families)**
- 71% of SCHS faculty and staff (136 out of 191 employees)**
- 45% of SCHS students (1183 out of 2652 students)**

This is the first year gotten over 330 families to complete the survey! 1653 surveys is the largest total number of surveys we have had completed in over 5 years.

The survey, which is the same as last year, was a national survey provided by the district, so the verbiage was not ideal for our stakeholders. Many people reported that they didn't like that the questions were stated so absolutely. For example: "All of my child's teachers give work that challenges my child." They felt that this skewed the results down.

The responses for each question were ranked and averaged similarly to how you would calculate a GPA.

- Strongly Agree = 5 points**
- Agree = 4 points**
- Neutral = 3 points**
- Disagree = 2 points**
- Strongly Disagree = 1 point**
- Not Applicable = 0 points**

With an average of 3 being a neutral response, **any question with an average above 3.5 would be a positive response**, 3-3.5 would be neutral, and **anything below 3 would be negative**. All questions were phrased positively, so a negative response would indicate an area for improvement.

# STUDENTS

## Strengths

The following things came up repeatedly in the open ended responses for what students like best about SCHS. They are proud to attend SCHS. They feel challenged and supported. They feel very connected to specialized programs like academies, sports, clubs and IB. They feel supported by most of their teachers and administrators. They feel connected and appreciate the electives we offer, especially the fine and performing arts.

## Areas for Improvement

Some of the areas for improvement are the same as last year. They include the state of the bathrooms (soap and paper towels are rarely full) and the general lack of cleanliness. They are frustrated by the number of standardized tests. They expressed concern that some teachers don't keep them informed about their grades in a timely manner and that they don't feel teachers always listen to them. The IB students expressed concern about the amount of homework. Last year there were a lot of concerns about the air conditioner, but it was not mentioned very much this year. Surprisingly, the uniform controversy was hardly mentioned.

# PARENTS/FAMILIES

## Strengths

The following were notable items or trends in the open ended question responses from parents. They believe SCHS is easily the best school in the district. At SCHS we provide a large number of opportunities for students to excel and find areas of interest. There is a lot of school spirit. The principal is very actively involved in all aspects of the school and is easily accessible. We have some great teachers who always go above and beyond. They feel their children are safe at Spruce Creek and that they are receiving a quality education.

## Areas for Improvement

The following things came up repeatedly in the open ended responses as areas for improvement. The facilities are too small and the cleaning is not up to the standards we should expect for our students. Parents are frustrated when teachers do not update grades or communicate in a timely manner. Some parents mentioned the amount of time our district spent on the uniform issue rather than addressing real needs in our schools. Several mentioned concerns that students who are not involved in a specialized program or sport can fall through the cracks. Quite a few parents mentioned needed updates to available technology. Guidance is stretched too thin to be able to provide adequate support for mental health issues and students who are struggling. They feel that in an effort to make procedures run more smoothly, school employees can come off as less than friendly toward parents and students. There were also quite a few mentions that teacher morale seemed low this year due to the contract negotiations and they wished that a resolution would be found so that their students continued to receive the best quality education possible.

# FACULTY AND STAFF

## Strengths

Our faculty and staff are overall proud of our school. They feel supported and like our school is a family. They like our tradition of excellence. They were appreciative of our updated teacher laptops this year and liked the time devoted to working with our PLCs because it provided a sense of not being on their own and a new sense of direction and ownership for the school. They love our students and many say they would not want to be anywhere but here.

## Areas for Improvement

The areas of concern mentioned in the open ended questions include facilities issues including cleanliness, the grounds, and temperature control. They are also concerned about the low teacher morale caused by district level struggles. At a school level, the lack of follow through when someone is not being a team player and a lack of consistency between administrators for evaluations is a frustration for many this year. Some mentioned a disconnect between some administrators and the teachers. There is also frustration with the amount of time spent testing, although that is primarily a state issue. They also continued to mention a lack of time. They appreciated the additional time devoted to PLCs, but it still wasn't enough. They also expressed concern with this climate survey in the fact that it used "ALL" too much.
